Wooden Car: \$1,000

Funding provided through the BEF Building STEAM 4 All Program

This project will fund materials for the Beaverton Science Specialist team to go to all 33 elementary schools and teach first grade students a science inquiry lesson. Students will learn about the motion of objects when a force is applied as they wind a rubber band around a wooden car and measure how far it goes over different surfaces.

Stretching Bodies, Stretching Minds: \$8,500 Funding provided through Regence BlueCross Blue Shield

This extended day academic and enrichment program for first through fifth grade students, recognizes the importance of movement to the brain's ability to cognitively function. The program will include time for a nutritious snack, physical activity and 40 minutes of instruction in reading, math, science and/or the arts.

Arts for Learning (A4L): \$625

Award to be used to fund two Arts for Learning units, with an artist in residence in one classroom in each grade 3-5. Arts for Learning integrates standards-focused, text-based content and arts strategies to improve students' achievement in literacy, learning and life skills.

Take Home Technology for Kindergarteners: \$950 Funding provided through the BEF Building STEAM 4 All Program

Although educational electronic games designed for early learners are available in stores, many students do not have access to these learning tools due to their cost. Grant funds will be used to purchase portable games by Vtech and Leap Frog for kindergarten students to take home on a rotating basis. Students will be able to hear, practice and identify letters of the alphabet and their sounds in a repeated and engaging manner.

Summer Science Scholars: \$10,000

Funding provided through the BEF Building STEAM 4 All Program

Grant funding will continue this successful BEF funded program for a second year. Summer Science Scholars is an intensive, inquiry based program, targeting students who not only have difficulty performing at grade level, but who are at-risk of regressing over the summer months. Students will participate in the continued expansion of the school community garden, by adding an outdoor classroom. Students will participate in targeted small group instruction, independent and cooperative literacy practice and math fluency activities.

Arts for Learning (A4L): \$312.50

Award to be used to fund one Arts for Learning unit, with an artist in residence in one classroom in each grade 3-5 during the spring. Arts for Learning integrates standards-focused, text-based content and arts strategies to improve students' achievement in literacy, learning and life skills.
